ADMINISTRATION OF NORWICH ARPA MUNICIPAL FUNDS FOR ARTS & CULTURE SUMMARY REPORT OF ACTIVITIES July 31, 2022

JULY ACTIVITIES

- An ad hoc Norwich Public Art Committee has been formed to help develop the process and procedure for creating public art with ARPA funds. The Committee will have their first meeting on August 4th. Committee includes representatives from the City, NCDC, Historical & Monuments Commissions, NPU, NAACP, Chamber and individual artists and residents. (Individual artists that live in Norwich and are interested in serving on the committee, please reach out to Sarbani at S.Hazra@culturesect.org)
- Executive Director Wendy Bury presented updates on the Norwich ARPA for Arts and Culture, including grant data, public art initiatives, and next 6 months of planned activities at the Norwich City Council Meeting on July 18.
- Proposal for a second round of ARPA for Arts and Culture funding was submitted to the City Manager.

JUNE ACTIVITIES

- The 1st round of the Norwich ARPA Grants for Arts & Culture received 20 applications requesting \$156,747 in funds and \$14,000 in Professional Development supplemental grant for a total of \$170,747 in requests.
- 12 applications were funded \$90,159 total grants + \$7,000 for Professional Development supplemental funds = \$97,159 total awarded.
 - a) 25% Artists, 58% Nonprofits, 17% For profit
 - b) 17% BIPOC applicants funded
 - 67% of applicants that asked for and received technical support via FBP & Arts & Culture Coordinator were funded
 - d) 25% youth-engaged use of funds
 - e) A majority of the use of funds will be used for Programs, Projects, and Events

MAY ACTIVITIES

• The 1st round of the Norwich ARPA Grants for Arts & Culture was launched from May 3, 2022 to May 23, 2022 (this round has closed).

- 20 applications received with a total amount requested of \$156,747 (this round will award up to \$100,000 in June).
- We are working with the City of Norwich to form a Public Art Selection Committee to support ARPA funded public art projects including RFP and selection of artwork for the new roundabout and other potential sites.

MARCH ACTIVITIES

Our Intent to Apply became available on March 29, 2022. Here were a few proposed projects:

- a) "Castle Church is activating an adjacent, blighted property on Broadway into a public park with the theme of resilience and with murals that engage that theme. The murals are the first phase of the project."
- b) "Tom Callinan/Crackerbarrel Entertainment using music and local history, students will learn about the challenges that figures from Norwich's past endured, and how their resilience helped them cope. Today's students have been living through the effects of COVID, and they will create a collaborative song related to their experiences."
- c) "Reliance Health has been part of the downtown Norwich fabric for over 45 years. The Iris Mural Project will contribute to the beautification of downtown while raising awareness about mental health and wellness."

June - Grant Awards are Announced

 Wendy and Sarbani presented updates on the Norwich ARPA Grant for Arts and Culture at the Norwich City Council Meeting on March 21, 2022.

Plan to use COVID-19 recovery grants for Norwich arts programs unveiled (The Day)

- We distributed the **ARPA Funding Needs Survey** in March to Norwich organizations, businesses, and artists. The survey asked how COVID has financially impacted organizations and artists, and what their funding priorities are. (15 respondents) Here are some key findings:
 - a) Operational and financial health:
 Almost half of the respondents (46.67%) assessed the current health for their business/organization was Fair, 40% assessed Healthy, and 13.33% assessed Struggling
 - b) The number one funding priority is **Programming/Events/Projects**. Second funding priority is **Capital Improvements**.
 - c) From March 2020-March 2022, the estimated total number of audience members/program attendees/customers lost was **63,641**.
 - d) Calculated budget shortfall/funding gap for calendar year 2022 is **\$445,300.** (9 respondents)
- We are currently working on RFPs for public art projects in Norwich. They will be tentatively released in early summer. Applicants with their own projects can apply.

FEBRUARY ACTIVITIES

 Organized and co-hosted a community conversation about public art in Norwich on 2/17/22 via ZOOM with NCDC/Global City, City Econ Dev Staff, Castle Church & Reliance Health. There were 47 Norwich community members involved in the discussion, and generated great feedback, input and comments.

Meeting takeaways:

- a) Community members identified and suggested locations where public art would have an impact. Public art in Norwich should include all parts of the city, not just downtown.
- b) Some ideas included a healing garden, pop up shops, food truck festival, and utilizing/beautifying spaces that are already in the city.
- c) Norwich Community Development Corporation, Global City Norwich, City of Norwich, Norwich Public Utilities, and Greater Norwich Area Chamber of Commerce understand the

value of the role public art plays in creating a vibrant city for residents, businesses and visitors.

- With community input, outlined a theme and focus for the ARPA funds (planning for a 2023 Norwich campaign)
- Drafting outline of the Norwich ARPA Arts & Culture funds grant program with focus on READI – Relevance, Equity, Accessibility, Diversity and Inclusion. Grant program development includes eligibility requirements, application criteria, grant amount levels, priority focus areas, data required for ARPA guidelines, national models/best practices, etc.

Outline of grant program also includes planning for: multiple rounds of grants, applications available in multiple languages, public workshops, accessibility options, and community outreach.

- Setup a registration form for those interested in receiving updates and information about Norwich ARPA funds dedicated to arts & culture (see list of registered entities below)
- Contacted all of our existing Norwich creative community contacts (95 registered partners in the City) to inform them of our process, timeline and how to get involved
- Provided updates regarding Norwich ARPA public input meetings through our monthly enewsletters and directly to the Norwich ARPA registered contact list
- Hosted 6 monthly, regular roundtable meetings with the creative community to hear about needs, priorities and plans

 - January 19, 2022
- Hired Sarbani Hazra as the Norwich Arts & Culture Coordinator to work with the Cultural Coalition to do outreach, (especially to those not currently connected with the Cultural Coalition) build relationships and help encourage collaboration (began late Dec.)
